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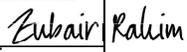
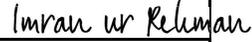
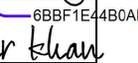

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ARTICLE (I): OVERVIEW

Section 1.0: Name

- The name of the organization shall remain NED Alumni Association of Alberta, herein after being called and referred to as NEDAAAB.
- NEDAAAB will remain as a social and professional association and shall exercise all its operations as a "Society Association.
- The main operational office of NEDAAAB can be Edmonton, Calgary or any city of Alberta based on the address that is disclosed in the annual return for the Society

Section 1.1: Vision

NEDAAAB is promoting NED University of Engineering & Technology (NEDUET), Karachi-Pakistan in Alberta and provides social and professional forum for NEDIANS of Alberta where they can interact for mutual benefit and growth.

Section 1.2: Mission

NEDAAAB strives hard to contribute positively to the overall growth of Alberta through the continuous induction of its best engineering professionals in the local job market. It encourages members to interact amongst themselves by participating in the social and professional events organized through its platform. NEDAAAB acts as a communication bridge between NED University of Engineering & Technology and its fellow members across Alberta.

Section 1.3: Objectives

The objectives of NEDAAAB are identified below as:

- 1.3.1 To serve as the linking pin between all NEDIANS throughout Canada especially in Alberta.
- 1.3.2 To promote, develop and maintain a unified alumni association by representing the best values and traditions of NEDUET.
- 1.3.3 To strive hard to establish professional name and image of NEDUET in the minds of Canadian recruiters.



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- 1.3.4 To create a conducive environment where members can share mutual experiences, knowledge and information for their professional growth and can interact amongst themselves.
- 1.3.5 To organize professional events for the benefit and growth of its members.
- 1.3.6 To provide social platform for alumni members where they can interact with each other.
- 1.3.7 To provide means to keep alumni members informed about important events and news related to NEDUET.
- 1.3.8 To develop a broad-based NEDIAN family in Alberta.

ARTICLE (II): CODE OF ETHICS

Section 2.0: Purpose

- 2.0.1 The operation and functionality of NEDAAAB requires members' confidence in the integrity of the elected committee members. As a cornerstone to this open, responsive and accountable elected committee, the code of ethics sets standard for the elected committee members in specific and for all registered committee members in general.
- 2.0.2 To cover all aspects of ethical requirements from every individual representing NEDAAAB, a separate by-law has been written to address this.

ARTICLE (III) - REGULATION AND BY-LAWS

Section 3.0: Purpose

The association may make by-laws under following conditions:

- 3.0.1 For the administration of the association and for managing and conducting its affairs.



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- 3.0.2 Redefining the location of the head office (if required) of the association.
- 3.0.3 Forming new chapter of NEDAAAB in any another city of Alberta.
- 3.0.4 Respecting the nomination, election, members & terms of elected committee, the discipline committee, appeal committee and other committees established by the association and prescribing their power.
- 3.0.5 Respecting the appointment, function, duties and power of an executive committee of the association.
- 3.0.6 Prescribing membership fees or expense receivable / payable to members of the association.
- 3.0.7 Regarding the establishment, collection and payment of sums of money for the short courses, seminars, lunch & learn sessions and any other session that association considers appropriate.

This Charter document provides an overall framework and guidance to operate NEDAAAB as an entity. However, where specific guidelines are required in any functional area, the sitting EC (executive committee) will define by-law(s) for that specific area/activity. The areas where by-laws is required, but not limited to, are as below:

1. Code of Ethics
2. Meeting Corium & Decorum
- 3.
4. Election Procedure
5. Financial Audit
6. Formation of new NEDAAAB Chapter
7. Moderating Social platform(s)

ARTICLE (IV): MEMBERSHIP

Section 4.0: Requirement

- 4.0.1 Any individual, irrespective of gender, who is a graduate from NED University of Engineering & Technology (Karachi-Pakistan) or from its affiliated institution, living in Alberta and willing to join the group can become a member of NEDAAAB.



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Section 4.1: Procedure

- 4.1.1 Any individual as described above can join NEDAAAB by submitting a duly filled membership form available online (NEDAAAB website) and paying onetime membership fees (where applicable).

Section 4.2: Tenure

- 4.2.1 The membership granted for NEDAAAB is lifetime. Once granted, it is subject to cancellation by the EC if found in non-compliance with section 4.0 of this article.

Section 4.3: Obligations

Every registered member has obligation for being a registered NEDAAAB member. Those obligations are:

- 4.3.1 Being in good morale standing as a citizen of Canada.
- 4.3.2 To abide by all the federal and provincial laws of government of Alberta and with government of Canada in general.
- 4.3.3 To abide by all the rules and bylaws as mentioned and related to the Charter of NEDAAAB.

Section 4.4: Benefits / Services

Being a registered member, every individual enjoys the following privileges:

- 4.4.1 Every member shall have full right to vote and contest in elections for any position in the “elected committee” and to participate in all benefits and programs of NEDAAAB.
- 4.4.2 Every member is entitled and privileged to and will be called to attend all activities / events offered by NEDAAAB and has rights to express their opinion on NEDAAAB forum.

Section 4.5: Honorary Membership

- 4.5.1 Any alumni member who has more than 25 years of professional experience in Alberta may be granted HONORARY MEMBERSHIP of NEDAAAB.



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- 4.5.2 Every honorary member is entitled and privileged to attend all the activities / events and shall also have equal right to express their opinion on alumni forum.
- 4.5.3 Every honorary member shall have full right to vote and contest in election for any position in the elected committee and can participate in all benefits and programs of the alumni.

ARTICLE (V): ELECTED COMMITTEE

To run day to day function of NEDAAAB, some individuals from the registered members are selected through an election process to perform operational activities. This group of individuals is hereinafter referred to as “The Elected Committee”.

Section 5.0: Fiscal Year

- 5.0.1 The fiscal year of NED Alumni Association of Alberta is defined from July 1st to June 30th of every year.

Section 5.1: Structure

- 5.1.1 The structure of the Elected Committee is as below:

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Section 5.2: Elected Committee Member

- 5.2.1 The selection of Elected Committee members on all offices will be done through election process held at the end of existing elected committee tenure (2) years.

Section 5.3: Placement

- 5.3.1 All elected committee members after being elected and after the official announcement disclosure of the election results, shall assumed to be functional as the office bearers in the elected committee of NEDAAAB.

Section 5.4: Tenure

- 5.4.1 The placement of all the office bearers in the elected committee of NEDAAAB shall be for two (2) years.
- 5.4.2 The existing elected committee will automatically be dissolved once the Election Committee has announced for executing the next tenure elections.
- 5.4.3 No individual can hold office for more than two (2) consecutive terms in the same capacity. However, he/she can serve EC third time in a different office.

Section 5.5: Resignation

- 5.5.1 Any elected committee member has the right to resign from office due to any personal reason.
- 5.5.2 The resignation shall be submitted to the President of NEDAAAB in written.
- 5.5.3 The resignation process shall be concluded in a month's time frame.
- 5.5.4 The resigning member shall continue duty until the resignation is approved.
- 5.5.5 The vacant position will be filled by the majority decision within the Elected committee.

Section 5.6: Voting Right

- 5.6.1 Every elected committee member has the right to vote in any decision-making matter of NEDAAAB.



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- 5.6.2 For every specific and unique matter, each vote will be considered as a single vote.
- 5.6.3 Every elected committee member has the right to NOT VOTE on any issue based on personal decision.
- 5.6.4 President is not entitled to vote unless a situation of tie arises in any matter/issue.

Section 5.7: Elected Committee Meeting Participation & Membership Continuing Requirement

- 5.7.1 For an elected committee member to remain part of the elected committee, EC member must attend at least 65% of the elected committee meetings during a fiscal year.

Section 5.8: Exclusion

- 5.8.1 Any elected committee member can remove from office within the tenure by a NO-CONFIDENCE MOTION raised and placed by any of the elected committee members.
- 5.8.2 The elected committee member raising the no-confidence motion must submit a written explanation for this to the president.
- 5.8.3 The president is responsible to form a three (3) member INVESTIGATION COMMITTEE from the elected committee members to investigate this matter.
- 5.8.4 The investigation committee is bound to conclude their findings within fifteen (15) days.
- 5.8.5 Based on the findings of the investigation committee, the no-confidence motion will be carried out in the next elected committee meeting through secret balloting.
- 5.8.6 The decision on the no-confidence motion shall be discharged or otherwise approved by two-third majority of the elected committee members.
- 5.8.7 In case if the no-confidence motion is against the president, it must be submitted in writing to the Vice-president, and he is responsible to form a three (3) members investigation committee from the elected members.



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ARTICLE (VI): ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Section 6.0: Immediate Past President

- 6.0.1 If new president is elected, former President will remain part of the elected committee to bridge the gap of experience and for the continuation of outstanding tasks.
- 6.0.2 Ideally attend all regular meetings of the elected committee.
- 6.0.3 Serve as a key advisor to the sitting committee elected.

Section 6.1: President

Sub-Section 6.1.1: Eligibility Requirement

- 6.1.1.1 President is required to be a registered member of NEDAAAB.
- 6.1.1.2 Any individual whose registered membership with NEDAAAB is for at least past two (2) years can contest for this office.
- 6.1.1.3 The contesting candidate is required to be a Registered Professional Engineer in any of the Canadian province.
- 6.1.1.4 The Contesting candidate at the time of election should not be serving in any other social or professional organization in any key position.

Sub-Section 6.1.2: Responsibilities

- 6.1.2.1 President shall be the head of the alumni (NEDAAAB).
- 6.1.2.2 Responsible for strategic and operational direction for NEDAAAB within the policies and objectives derived from this Charter and determined by its By-Laws.
- 6.1.2.3 Responsible to emancipate all the decisions of NEDAAAB as the final authority.
- 6.1.2.4 Responsible to make sure that NEDAAAB is being governed by its Charter.
- 6.1.2.5 has the right to veto any elected committee decision in the broader interest of NEDAAAB.



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- 6.1.2.6 2/3rd majority of elected committee has the right to over-rule president's veto decision in the broader interest of NEDAAAB.
- 6.1.2.7 Responsible for developing the annual strategic plan in consultation with the elected committee that states the objectives and associated performance measures for the year.
- 6.1.2.8 Responsible for producing the end-of-year report in consultation with the elected committee that summarizes accomplishments for the year and makes recommendations for future actions.
- 6.1.2.9 Can render services in any taskforce as well as can also lead any taskforce.

Section 6.2: Vice - President

Sub-Section 6.2.1: Eligibility Requirement

- 6.2.1.1 Vice President is required to be a registered member of NEDAAAB.
- 6.2.1.2 Any individual whose registered membership with NEDAAAB is for at least past two (2) years can contest for this office.
- 6.2.1.3 The contesting candidate is required to be a Registered Professional Engineer in any of the Canadian province.
- 6.2.1.4 The Contesting candidate at the time of election should not be serving in any other social or professional organization in any key position.

Sub-Section 6.2.2: Responsibilities

- 6.2.2.1 Shall assist the president in all NEDAAAB related activities.
- 6.2.2.2 Responsible to act on behalf of the president in his/her absence and emancipate all activities as mentioned in article VI; section 2.0; sub-section 2.2
- 6.2.2.3 In case of resignation from the president, vice-president will resume the role of president till the EC decides the path forward for filling president's position.
- 6.2.2.4 Can render services in any taskforce as well as can also lead any taskforce.



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Section 6.3: General Secretary

Sub-Section 6.3.1: Eligibility Requirement

- 6.3.1.1 General Secretary is required to be a registered member of NEDAAAB.
- 6.3.1.2 Any individual who is a registered member with NEDAAAB can contest for this office.
- 6.3.1.3 The contesting candidate is required to be a Registered Professional Engineer in any of the Canadian province.
- 6.3.1.4 The Contesting candidate at the time of election should not be serving in any other social or professional organization in any key position.

Sub-Section 6.3.2: Responsibilities

- 6.3.2.1 Shall see that the notices are duly given in accordance with the provision of the charter or as required by the elected committee decision.
- 6.3.2.2 Shall be the custodian of all official records in duplicate, except the records concerning finance, which will be maintained by Treasurer.
- 6.3.2.3 Responsible for all the provision of advice to the elected committee members of NEDAAAB offices and for the implementation of its decisions.
- 6.3.2.4 Responsible for the coordination of all the operations and activities of NEDAAAB under the directives defined by the President.
- 6.3.2.5 Shall maintain the record of all registered members.
- 6.3.2.6 Shall act as a spokesman of NEDAAAB and responsible for all formal communication of the alumni matter outside the elected committee.
- 6.3.2.7 Shall record the minutes of the elected committee meetings and distribute it within a reasonable time frame.
- 6.3.2.8 Responsible for releasing information (where required) related to the meeting of the elected committee to the registered members of NEDAAAB.
- 6.3.2.9 Shall perform any duty assigned by the President from time to time necessary for the effective and efficient operation of NEDAAAB.



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6.3.2.10 Can render services in any taskforce and can lead any taskforce.

Section 6.4: Treasurer

Sub-Section 6.4.1: Eligibility Requirement

6.4.1.1 Treasurer is required to be a registered member of NEDAAAB.

6.4.1.2 Any individual who is a registered member with NEDAAAB can contest for this office.

6.4.1.3 The contesting candidate is required to be a Registered Professional Engineer in any of the Canadian province.

6.4.1.4 The Contesting candidate at the time of election should not be serving in any other social or professional organization in any key position.

Sub-Section 6.4.2: Responsibilities

6.4.2.1 Responsible for receiving and maintaining all funds paid to NEDAAAAB.

6.4.2.2 Responsible for planning the entire budget for the fiscal year.

6.4.2.3 responsible for maintaining cash-flow records for all activities.

6.4.2.4 Responsible for managing all accounts.

6.4.2.5 Responsible for providing year-end financial statements for NEDAAAB accounts.

6.4.2.6 Responsible for proposing as asset allocation model for future projects and events of NEDAAAB.

6.4.2.7 Has an authority to spend up to \$500/- CAD on any project/event of NEDAAAB.

6.4.2.8 Responsible to take approval (written if possible) for any expense exceeding \$500/- CAD from president.

6.4.2.9 Responsible for directing fund raising efforts and activities.

6.4.2.9.1 Responsible for tax-return and for facilitating NEDAAAB financial audit as required by law for a society being registered under "Societies Act".



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Section 6.5: Information Technology (IT) Secretary

Sub-Section 6.5.1: Eligibility Requirement

6.5.1.1 Information technology Secretary is required to be a registered member of NEDAAAB.

6.5.1.2 Any individual who is a registered member with NEDAAAB can contest for this office.

Section 6.5.2: Responsibilities

6.5.2.1 Responsible for maintaining the website of NEDAAAB and solving all its related issues.

6.5.2.2 Responsible for maintaining database of all the records related to the alumni membership.

6.5.2.3 Responsible of leading the team of discussion forum administrator and moderator.

6.5.2.4 Shall perform any duty assigned by the president from time to time necessary for the effective and efficient operation of NEDAAAB.

6.5.2.5 Can render services in any taskforce and can lead any taskforce.

Section 6.6: NED Liaison Secretary

Sub-Section 6.6.1: Eligibility Requirement

6.6.1.1 NED Liaison Secretary is required to be a registered member of NEDAAAB.

6.6.1.2 Any individual who is a registered member with NEDAAAB can contest for this office.

Section 6.6.2: Responsibilities

6.6.2.1 Responsible for the coordination between NEDAAAB and NED University of Engineering & Technology, Karachi Pakistan.

6.6.2.2 Shall perform any duty assigned by the president from time to time necessary for the effective and efficient operation of NEDAAAB.

6.6.2.3 Can render services in any taskforce and can lead any taskforce.



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Section 6.7: Executive Member

Sub-Section 6.7.1: Eligibility Requirement

6.7.1.1 Executive members are required to be a registered member of NEDAAAB.

6.7.1.2 Any individual who is a registered member with NEDAAAB can contest for this office.

Section 6.7.2: Responsibilities

6.7.2.1 Responsible for helping in the on-going task throughout the tenure.

6.7.2.2 Shall perform any duty assigned by the president from time to time necessary for the effective and efficient operation of NEDAAAB.

6.7.2.3 Can render services in any taskforce and can lead any taskforce.

ARTICLE (VII): OTHER APPOINTMENTS

Section 7.0: Task Force

Sub-Section 7.0.1: Appointment

7.0.1.1 To achieve any specific task, a small group from the elected committee could be formed. This committee is referred to as the TASK FORCE.

7.0.1.2 Any member, whether registered member or elected committee member, can be a part of this committee.

7.0.1.3 President has the right to nominate directly any individual from the elected committee member as the head of this task force or any registered committee member to be the part of this task force considering individual capabilities.



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7.0.1.4 Any elected committee member can nominate any registered member to participate in a task force depending on the skills and expertise of that individual after the approval by two-third majority of the elected committee members.

Sub-Section 7.0.2: Responsibilities

7.0.2.1 The taskforce shall have a specific objective to achieve within a limited time frame, hence having a short-term responsibility to perform.

Sub-Section 7.0.3: Abolishment

7.0.3.1 These taskforces are automatically considered as “dissolved” immediately after the task is completed.

Section 7.1: Special Appointment

Sub-Section 7.1.1: Advisor

Clause A: Nomination

- A1 An external nomination as an “Advisor” from the elected committee (where needed) could be put forward based on the requirement for the position.
- A2 An elected committee member can propose any registered member for this appointment.
- A3 The proposed nomination for this special appointment shall be approved by the two-third majority of the elected committee members.
- A4 Advisor is not supposed to be part of the elected committee and has no right to vote in any of the elected committee meeting motion.

Clause B: Tenure

- B1 The tenure for this special appointment will automatically be terminated with the abolishment of the committee elected by the end of its tenure.



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Clause C: Responsibilities

- C1 The responsibilities of this special appointment will remain but not restricted to the task he/she is appointed for.

ARTICLE (VIII): MEETINGS

Section 8.0: Types of Meetings

Sub-Section 8.0.1: Annual General Body Meeting

Annual General Body Meeting (AGM) of all the registered members of NEDAAAB shall be held at least once every year on a specific date, time and place at the close of each fiscal year, but not later than 30th of June. The business of the general body meeting shall be, but not limited to:

- 8.0.1.1 To discuss with general members, the elected committee reports on the progress and working of the alumni during the previous year.
- 8.0.1.2 8.0.1.2 To discuss the treasury report and the audited account of alumni for the previous year.
- 8.0.1.3 To discuss newly elected committee and to appoint auditors for next tenure (if required and agreed within the elected committee).
- 8.0.1.4 To deal with such other matters as may be put before it.

Sub-Section 8.0.2: Elected Committee Meeting

- 8.0.2.1 To execute the intended function of NEDAAAB, it is required that the elected committee members assemble once a month. This gather shall be referred as "Elected Committee Meeting".
- 8.0.2.2 the agenda of the elected committee meeting should be pre-defined and agreed upon to the meeting. Any possible mechanism (most probably email) could be used to exercise this requirement.



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8.0.2.3 Minutes of the elected committee meeting shall be recorded and be distributed to the entire elected committee members in a reasonable time frame.

Sub-Section 8.0.3: Special Meeting

8.0.3.1 Special meeting of members may be held upon the call of the president or based on majority of the elected committee members.

8.0.3.2 Proper communication amongst the elected committee members such as date, time, place and purpose of the meeting is required.

Sub-Section 8.0.4: Extra-Ordinary General Meeting

An extraordinary general meeting of the association shall be convened when:

8.0.4.1 The committee elected deems it desirable.

8.0.4.2 At the point request in writing of not less than one-fifth (1/5th) of the total registered members stating the objectives and reason for such meeting. Such request shall be addressed to the President.

Sub-Section 8.0.5: Taskforce Meeting

The taskforce meeting may be executed among the members of the task force to expedite the task assigned by the elected committee. Provision for notice. Quorum and minutes are totally at the discretion of the taskforce.

ARTICLE (IX): FEES & DUES

Section 9.0: Registration Fees

9.0.1 The registration fees as decided by the elected committee shall be applicable to all the registered members. Their membership will be subject to the payment of these registration fees.



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9.0.2 The mode of payment of the registration fee or any other dues shall be either by cheque, cash or also by online payment through NEDAAAB website.

Section 9.1: Special Event Fees

9.1.1 The fees to be collected for any special events (when organized) shall be decided and agreed by the elected committee and will be communicated to the registered members during execution of the event.

ARTICLE (X): FINANCIAL AUDIT

Section 10.0: Requirement and Commencement

10.0.1 NEDAAAB may facilitate an independent audit of its financial statements by the end of any elected committee tenure.

10.0.2 The audit should be conducted by any knowledgeable individual / subject matter expert the society (alumni) outside of sitting elected committee.

10.0.3 The audit should result in the publication of an annual financial report with an option on whether the financial statements are relevant, accurate and complete.

ARTICLE (XI): SIGNING POWERS

Section 11.0: Payments / Withdraws / Disposition of Funds

11.0.1 All cheques, bills of exchange or other orders for the payment of money in the name of NEDAAAB shall be signed either by the President or by the Financial Secretary. In the absence or unavailability of anyone of them, Vice-President can sign on the absentee's behalf.



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- 11.0.2 Any member of the EC (elected committee) may be assigned through resolution to endorse notes and cheques only for the deposit with the bank for the credit of NEDAAAB account.

ARTICLE (XII): AMMENDMENTS

Section 12.0: Changes / Additions / Deletions in Charter and its By-Laws

- 12.0.1 Any proposed amendments, suspensions, alterations in this Charter and its By-laws shall be presented in writing to the EC. A vote of two-thirds of the majority of the elected committee members is required to approve such proposed changes.
- 12.0.2 Any such proposed change shall be notified in writing to all EC members by the President fifteen (15) days prior to the EC meeting.
- 12.0.3 Any changes to the Charter or its By-Laws approved as per section 1.1 & 1.2 of this article (Article XII) shall become effective immediately on approval.

ARTICLE (XIII): HANDLING DISPUTE

Section 13.0: Dispute between Members

- 13.0.1 Out of society affairs, if in case, a dispute arises between two (2) registered members, the dispute shall be handled by an impartial committee.
- 13.0.2 President, Vice President or General Secretary will form a three (3) members committee under his/her supervision to resolve the dispute.
- 13.0.3 For this committee, President, Vice President or General Secretary can nominate any member from EC or outside EC.
- 13.0.4 This committee must be approved by two-thirds of the elected committee members.



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- 13.0.5 The disputing parties will be informed about the committee composition before starting any proceedings.
- 13.0.6 If any affected party objects to the nomination of any of the members (conflict of interest situation), that member shall be replaced by another member.
- 13.0.7 The committee will evaluate the dispute by looking into the matter and gather information and any evidence (where applicable) to reach a decision within fifteen (15) days.
- 13.0.8 The parties will be informed about the decision and bound to abide by that with its entirety.

ARTICLE (XIV): DISSOLUTION

Section 14.0: Purpose

- 14.0.1 In case the government authorities request the closure of the activities of NEDAAAB with any legal reason, the President shall dissolve the association after consulting the EC (elected committee).
- 14.0.2 In the event of dissolution or discontinuance of NEDAAAB, the EC (elected committee) shall transfer such funds, money and other possessions after paying all outstanding liabilities to NED for the welfare of its students.
